PROSTITUTION ARRESTS

SSPD Vice officers conducted a joint undercover internet prostitution operation with the Atlanta FBI MATCH Task Force at an area hotel on Thursday evening.

The detectives made 4 physical arrests of females for Solicitation for Illicit Sexual Acts (Prostitutes), 1 being a repeat-arrest for SSPD.

Three physical arrests of males for Solicitation for Illicit Sexual Acts (Pimps) were made.
They made one arrest for Possession of Marijuana.

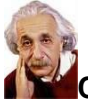

The unit sergeant documented that it is harder to get the prostitutes and pimps to come to any Sandy Springs locations due to the reputation of enforcement. Good times.

ROBBERY

66 Northwood Drive 30342 3/28
A woman reported that just before 1 a.m. she was standing outside her apartment smoking a cigarette when three Hispanic males, 18-20 years old, came up to her, pushed her into a wall, threatened her, and took her cell phone.

BURGLARY

900 block of Cimarron Pkwy 30350 3/29
Someone entered the victim's apartment through the patio door and stole a computer.

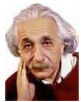
ASSAULTS

ARRESTS



5800 block Roswell Road 30328 3/28

An officer passed by the parking lot of a bar and reported that he heard a loud argument (even with his windows up) in the lot. He said he spoke to the couple and the female seemed to be venting very loudly. He let her talk for a while but realized she was very drunk and becoming more belligerent. She said she was mad at the male because he was arrested for DUI the night before and couldn't drive her home now. The man ran across Roswell Road and behind the Whole Foods Store. The man was cornered by the cops and taken into custody. He was drunk. He said he ate the food but ran out so he wouldn't have to pay. He said his girlfriend had the money and she wanted to spend it on crack cocaine. The employees said the man tried to pay with a debit card but it was declined. He then punched one employee in the chest and the other in the face before running. He was arrested.

PEOPLE WITH ISSUES

A man reported that an ex-girlfriend showed up at his residence while he was there with a date. She was disruptive and he called the cops who showed up and told her to leave. She demanded to make a domestic violence report concerning an incident two years ago. She has since texted the victim and generally not acting too nice.

500 block of Northridge Road 30350 3/30
A man called the police after he refused to let his girlfriend into the apartment. He said she was doing drugs. She kicked in the front door so he locked himself in the bedroom and called the police because he was afraid she would hurt him. The officers arrested the woman and made the apartment safe again for the man.

Cops answered a fight call at the Home Depot parking area. The officers were told by 9-1-1 that a woman was jumping on the hood of the complainant's car. The complainant said the woman was running from the location after biting him on the arm. The woman apparently slashed the victim's tires and damaged the hood of the car before running off. She was found and detained. At first she blamed her mother for the hood damage (I'm not sure where she was going with this) but later admitted to the hood damage. She was arrested. The report said she was loud and unruly in the back of the patrol car.

5400 block of Glenridge Drive 30342 3/31
A woman reported that she pulled into her apartment area and while exiting her car, observed a man in another car fondling himself while looking at another woman. The man saw her but continued with his pursuit of immediate gratification. The officer later spoke to the man who denied the accusation and said the woman was made because he followed her car into the security gated area.
